INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF BEYOND STIGMA COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Beyond Stigma Company Limited by Guarantee ("the company") for the year ended 30 June 2026, which comprise the Profit and Loss Account, Balance Sheet, Cash Flow Statement and the notes to the financial statements including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 3. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish Law and FRS 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in the United Kingdom by the Financial Reporting Council.

In our opinion, the financial statements:

- have been properly prepared in accordance with FRS 102 *The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland*; and
